





BA (Hons) Hand Embroidery is a world-renowned course delivered by the Royal School of Needlework (RSN) in dedicated studios at Hampton Court Palace.

As the only full-time specialist Degree in Hand Embroidery, the course has been designed to provide a dynamic learning experience that connects individual creative practice with textile and design theory. Study is in small groups with close tutor support and guidance from experienced academics and professional RSN embroidery tutors.




Exploring traditional hand embroidery techniques within a contemporary context, you will learn about the industry and the career opportunities within it. You will also develop creative approaches to drawing, design and practice-based research to inform your evolving stitch practice.



The Royal School of Needlework has long-established and international industry links which provide opportunities to engage with live projects, as well as industry insights from an extensive guest lecturer programme. Our high profile and established connections also provide students with valuable networking opportunities.

Students have access to a dedicated library and IT suite on-site, as well as specialist hand embroidery tools and equipment. Students can also enjoy exquisite and rarely seen embroideries to support their learning.

Thanks to generous supporters of the Royal School of Needlework, we are able to make bursary awards to some of our Degree students.








