



If teaching embroidery and passing on your passion in needlework to the next generation sounds like the perfect career opportunity, the RSN's Future Tutors Programme is for you.

Designed for men and women who want a career in teaching hand embroidery to the highest standard, this three year full-time course at Hampton Court Palace is the RSN's own professional qualification and includes a teaching qualification to City & Guilds Level 3.

#### The programme provides you with:

- Technical skills in a wide variety of hand embroidery techniques
- Knowledge of teaching theory and practice
- Elements of commercial practice relevant to freelance embroiderers

#### On completion you will have:

- The skills to teach hand embroidery techniques to RSN Certificate, Diploma and Degree level
- The skills to work as a professional embroiderer in a commercial studio
- Some experience of restoration and conservation work
- A broad insight into the life of a freelance embroiderer



#### What techniques can I learn?

Jacobean Crewelwork, Blackwork, Canvas Stitches, Silk Shaded Botanical, Basic Goldwork, Appliqué, Coronation Goldwork, Silk Shaded Animal, Canvas Shading, Stumpwork, General Whitework, Box Making, Fine Whitework, Creative Metal Threadwork, Cords & Tassels, Beadwork, Tambour Beadwork, Both-Sides-Alike, Quilting & Silk Shaded Figure.

#### Where can I learn?

Students are based at Hampton Court Palace, south west London. They also spend time teaching and demonstrating at public shows around the country and assist with classes and exhibitions.

#### Your tuition week includes:

- 2 days technical stitch instruction for 1st and 2nd year students and Studio training for 3rd years
- 2 days self-directed working on teaching files and assessment pieces. Each completed module is assessed and requires a high standard of achievement to demonstrate full understanding of the skills learned
- 1 day combination of Art, Business Skills and Off-site study trips

You will have eight weeks off during the year: two weeks at both Christmas and Easter, and four weeks during the summer.

#### Entry Qualifications:

A good level of education to A Level, or equivalent, including a high standard of written and spoken English. No previous experience of embroidery is required but some knowledge of art and design is useful. Good communication and motor skills are required and the ability to pay attention to fine detail.

#### How much does it cost?

The full fee for the Future Tutors Programme is £13,000 per annum (for Sept 2021 intake).

For UK citizens, the RSN endeavours to raise funds to reduce this, although this is becoming more challenging.

For 2020-21 intake, fees were £6,500 per annum plus materials costs. Final fees for 2021-22 intake are yet to be determined but will be between £6,500 and £7,000 plus materials.

Once on the course you will continue to pay the same amount each year.

Usually, you will have the opportunity to undertake paid work from year two.
