

Travel information: How to get to the RSN

Founded 1872

Hampton Court Palace is located by the River Thames in south west London. It is within the M25, six miles from the start of the M3 and eight miles from the start of the M4. Look for the brown attraction signs that direct you to Hampton Court Palace. The RSN is situated on the East Front of the palace and overlooks the Formal Gardens and Long Water.

By car: Hampton Court Palace is located on the A308 and is well signposted from all the major local roads. From the M25 either take exit 10 on to the A3 and A309 or exit 12 on to the M3 and A308. The Ultra-Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) may affect visitors coming by car, please check the TFL website before you travel.

Parking: Some paid for parking is available at Hampton Court Palace. Parking is also available at Hampton Court train station and Hampton Court Green.

By bus: From Kingston buses 111, 411 and 216 pass the palace. The bus stop is on the opposite side of the road to Kingston train station entrance.

By train: National Rail train services run direct from London Waterloo to Hampton Court taking 35 minutes and the palace is a five-minute walk across the bridge from the station. There are also trains from London Waterloo to Kingston from where you can take a bus. Both train services pass through Wimbledon station connecting with the London Underground District Line. Hampton Court and Kingston are in Travel Zone 6.

Directions within Hampton Court Palace: Make your way down the main driveway, turn left and immediate right into Tennis Court Lane.

Please call into the security office, adjacent to the barrier, where you will be provided with a temporary pass. A member of RSN staff will meet you there.

This pass is only for the purpose of visiting the Royal School of Needlework and does not allow access to other parts of the palace.
