The **RSN's Professional Embroidery Tutor Programme** is for anyone seeking a career as a professional embroiderer and is the only course for those wishing to teach for the RSN. This three-year programme strategically combines dedicated teaching hours of two days per week with independent study at home for the remainder of the week, giving flexibility to the student.

Alongside learning hand embroidery techniques, students work on a portfolio, cover Art & Design and Business Skills, and have opportunities for Teaching Practice.











This specialist course offers six places, including the RSN's Scholarship for an 18-25 year old UK resident, who shows the potential for excellence in the art of hand embroidery.

Hand embroidery is a specialist subject and the application of this skill is diverse, with RSN Professional Embroiderers enjoying successful careers in teaching hand embroidery as well as working on commissions, kits, and classes with other schools and businesses.
